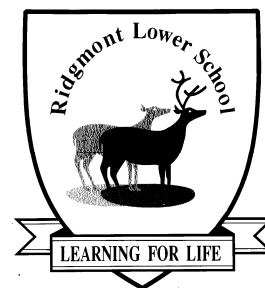


Parental Questionnaire - summary sheet July 2009

The table below is taken from the model Ofsted parental questionnaire. All 39 families whose children attended the school in July 2009 (54 children in total) were asked to complete the questionnaire. (22) 56% responded. (4.5% = 1 parent)

- 17 questionnaires were returned with no further comments.
- I commented that parent should know about how 'Jolly Phonics' are taught.
- 1 parent said that although she did not feel that her son was actually bullied she did feel that one particular child harassed him. She also commented that she appreciated the school were continuously addressing this sort of problem.
- Two parents commented that they were never asked for their views.
- Responding to 'Teaching is good' a parent commented that the supervised reading in class 3 was unacceptable.
- 1 parent commented that she did not know if her child behaves well, or if her child was bullied, but that her child did talk to her about a lot of incidents. The same parent said that she did not feel there was enough generic information about where they should be in terms of their learning/ their targets and wanted a half termly message about arrears of weakness / what can be improved. The same parent commented that a note book would be a useful means of communication and that she was disappointed that a reading book was not always sent home every night.
