NON-FICTION: Animal Biographies – Wild Lives Summary of content **Focus** Genre and texts Texts studied Introduce biography using this inspiring collection of animal stories: WildLives: 50 Extraordinary Animals that Made History. Wild Lives: 50 Extraordinary Animals that Made History by Ben Lerwill Children read and discuss them, summarise Comprehension **Biographies** events using timelines, use dictionaries to create glossary definitions, answer formal comprehension questions and write film pitch letters for their favourite animal story.
